A NOTE FROM THE ACTING CEO:

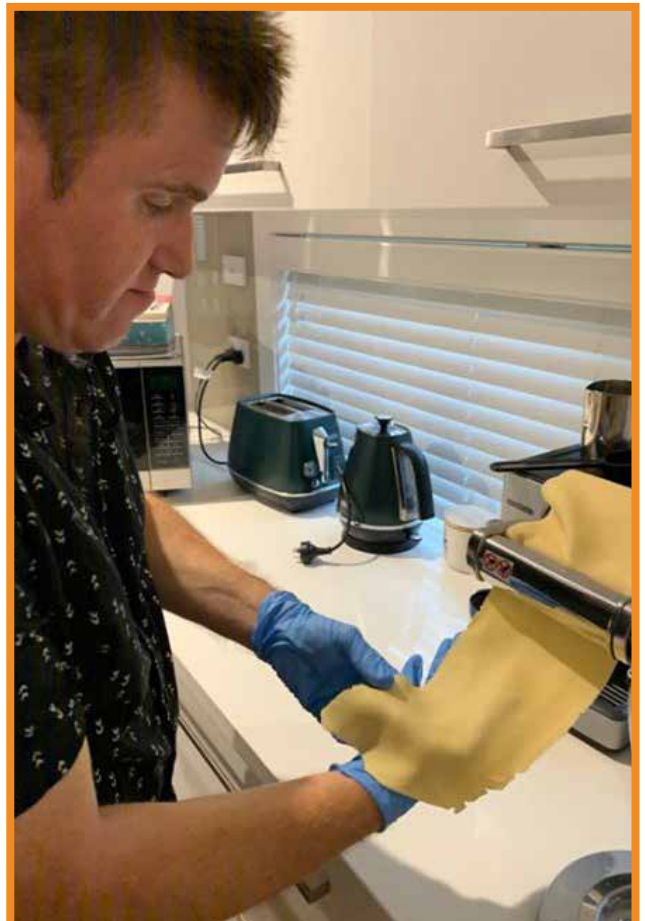
Hello,

Like everyone today, New Haven Farm Home has been significantly affected by the Covid-19 pandemic.
